1. If you started LUJ Academic in Summer 2016 or before, you must complete 61 credits with an overall GPA 2.0 or higher to graduate. If you joined the academic program in Fall 2016 or later, you need to complete 60 units.
2. You may take 12-14 credits every semester until your last 2 semesters. To take 15 or more credits, you need the approval of your advisor and the dean.
3. You must take Writing Workshop, Composition I, and Composition II in your first 3 terms unless you test out of these classes or have transfer credit.
4. You should take Knowing the Self (GEN 130) no later than the second term.
5. Humanities I requires you to pass the Workshop classes or test equivalents.
6. Students who already speak two or more languages, as evidenced by a TOEFL score or other certification, are exempt from World Languages.
7. 1st and 2nd semester academic students are not allowed to take 200-level courses without special approval from the dean.
8. Some courses are only 1 credit. Lab courses are 4 credits. See the number in purple after the class code if the course has a number of units other than 3.
9. You are strongly recommended to wait to take Mass Media, Public Speaking, History, Logic, and Religion until you complete Composition I.
10. If you joined academic in Summer 2018 or later, only one Workshop course may have units applied to the A.A. or B.A. degree, but only the best grade (3 units) will be applied. If you joined previously, only the two best grades (6 units) will be applied.
